# Please be advised that these works have been subject to a date amendment due to poor weather conditions, amendments in red below:

Please be advised that circumstances and weather permitting, SWH will be undertaking essential highway maintenance on Higher Compton Road, on behalf of Plymouth City Council. The works will be undertaken over six nights, from Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> November to Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2023, between the hours of 19:00 and 06:00. Please be advised that we have accommodated additional days as a contingency, further to the above dates, for unforeseen circumstances that may arise as a result of plant breakdown, poor weather etc.

In order to carry out these carriageway resurfacing and lining works, we will be enforcing a series of traffic management restrictions on Higher Compton Road, Reservoir Road and Reservoir Lane.

## Road Closures:

- Higher Compton Road, from the junction of Mannamead Road to the junction of Widey View.
- Reservoir Road & Lane from junction with Higher Compton to junction with Eggbuckland Road

<u>Please note the Lockington Avenue one-way system to be revoked to two-way traffic. Any bus</u> <u>stops, bus lanes and cycle lanes within these closure points will be suspended for the duration of</u> <u>these works.</u>

 Higher Compton Road, Eggbuckland Road, Mannamead Road, Bainbridge Avenue, Lockington Avenue & Hill Lane
