Year 3 News:



On Wednesday, year 3 visited The Box museum to learn more about life in the Bronze Age. We had the opportunity to become trainee archaeologists and look at some artefacts and replicas of artefacts found in a cist (coffin) on Dartmoor.

What might we learn about their lives from the objects that they left behind?

As part of our training, we were taught to ask enquiry questions when looking at different artefacts. Asking questions starting with who, what, where, when, why and how to figure out what it

might be. As archaeologists we learnt that we need to ask lots of questions and try not to make assumptions or jump to any conclusions about an object. We then thought about how these might have been traded, created or found. Lots of us were drawn to the bearskin and the necklace beads.



We all agreed that there must have been some skilled people to create cloth materials, jewellery beads from clay.

We then explored the museum and lots of other artefacts linked to our learning and our local Plymouth History. We're now looking forward to seeing how life changed when the Iron Age began.
