Year Group News

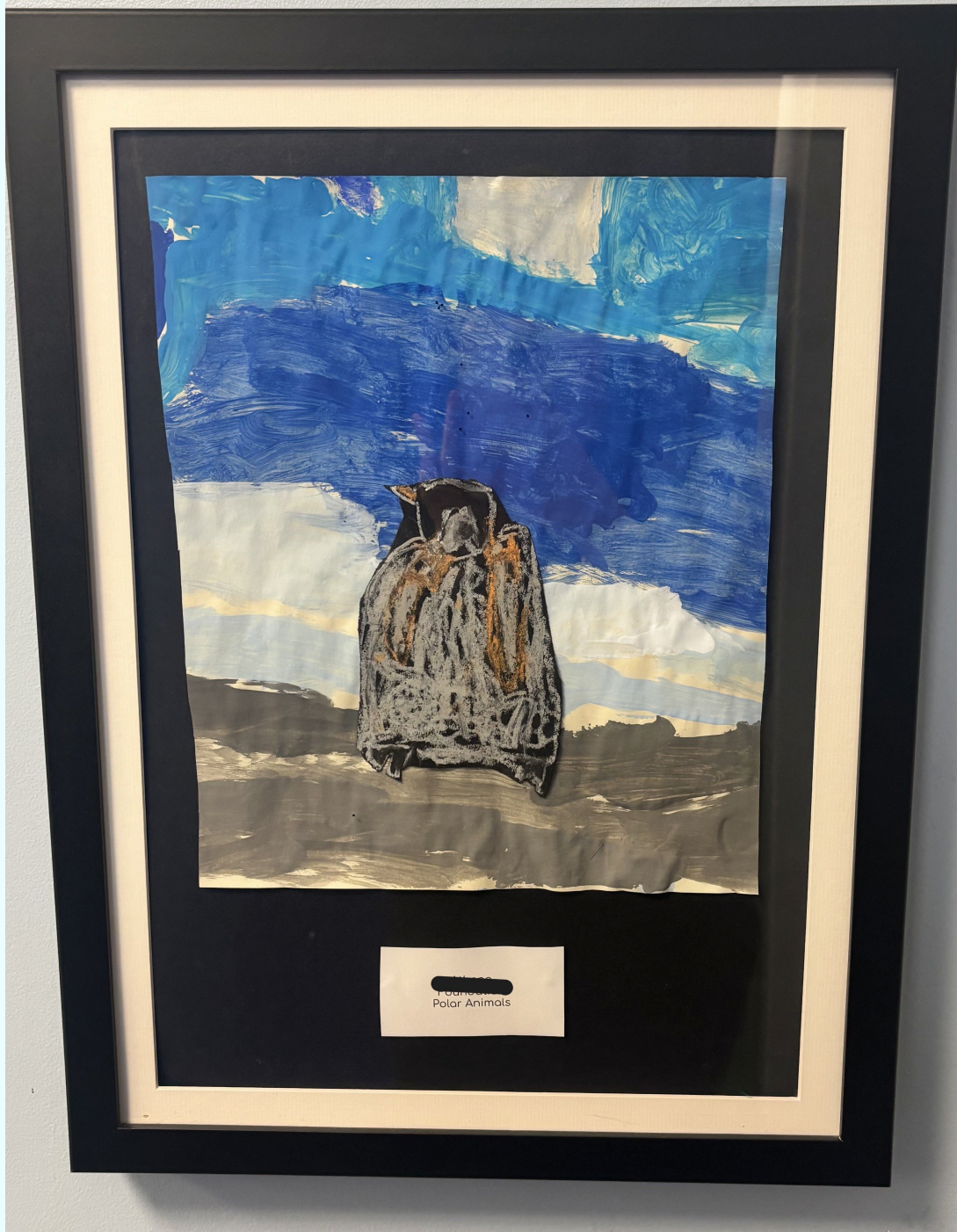
Year 2
