Year Group News

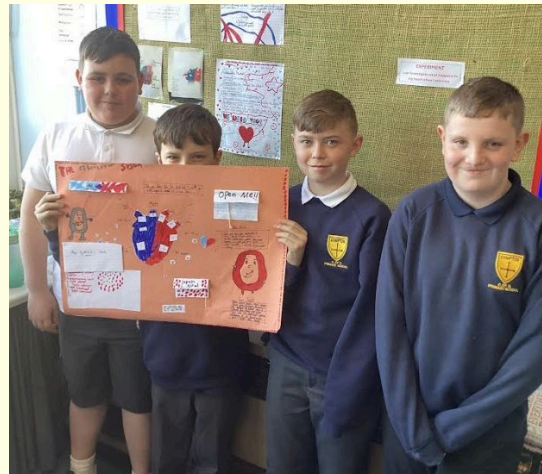
Year 6
