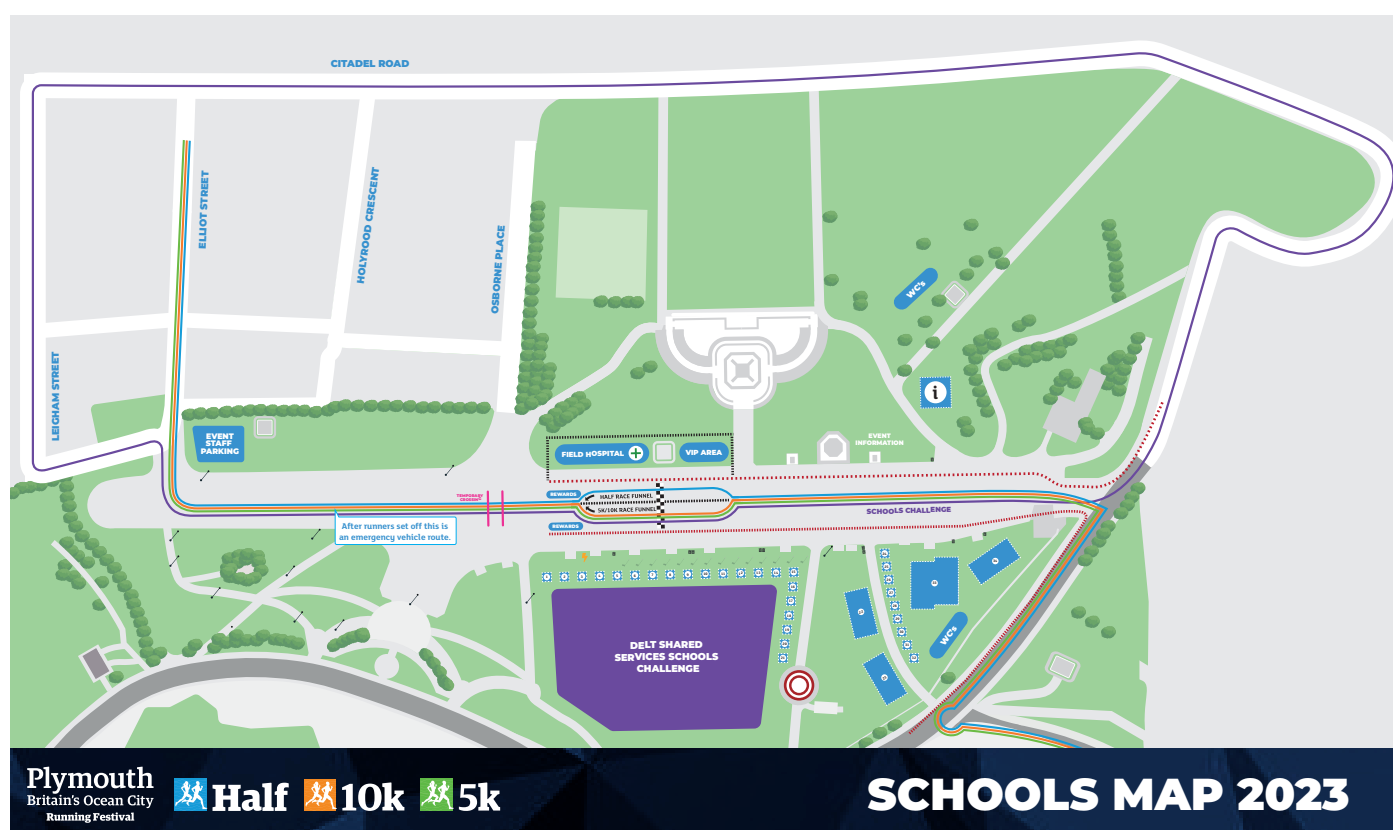


DELT Shared Services Schools' Challenge 2023

Travel Arrangements

Britain's Ocean City Running Festival is staged on closed roads, which will inevitably cause some disruption. Please take note of road traffic operatives and signage. Road Closures and diversions come into effect from **04:00 - 14:00** on **Sunday 14th May 2023**.

Bus Services

Plymouth Bus Station, based on Mayflower Street is located within a 20-minute walk of the start via Royal Parade and Armada Way and will be operating a normal service with the exception of; West Bound Royal Parade, West Bound Viaduct and City Bound Exeter Street.

Meeting Points

- Please arrange a meeting point for parents to drop their children off.
- Please take into account the road closures that will be in place and allow time for people to arrive. All details can be found at www.runplymouth.co.uk
- Children with severe disabilities will have vehicular access to The Hoe via Elliott Street - please notify us of the number of vehicles and the registration plate so that passes can be allocated. Drivers **MUST** proceed under instruction at 5mph. We will also need to know if these runners are to be collected after the event.

Timings / Format / Signing In & Out

- The Schools' Challenge holding area opens from 10:30am. You should be in here with your full group of children no later than 11:15am.
- Children will move into their race funnel for 11:30am.
- Schools' Challenge starts at 11:45am.
- There will be a staggered start with three distinct areas. All staff must label the children's numbers with A, B or C and ensure that runners enter the start/finish funnel when directed to do so.
- You will be led to the start – please do not take your group until you are asked to do so.
- On completion of the run, children will be presented with their medal and asked to collect a snack and bottle of water before returning to their school area – please note that staff **MUST NOT** accept medal or snack as these have been allocated for children only. (a bottle of water is fine).
- All teachers and children must meet in the Holding Area once again after the Challenge. Once your whole group is back and have their rewards, you can sign your group out and take them to meet the parents (approx. 12:15).
- **PLEASE NOTE - NO PARENTS ARE ALLOWED IN THE SCHOOL'S CHALLENGE AREA.**

Clothing & Belongings

- All teachers and children must wear their event t-shirts and race numbers for the race. These **MUST** be clearly visible on entry to the challenge area to ensure a speedy entrance. We ask that all participants dress appropriately according to the weather.
- Please note that PSSP or Redrok Events cannot take any responsibility for any items that are left in the School's Challenge Holding Area.

Health & Safety

- Teachers are responsible for signing their pupils in and out of the Schools' Holding Area and for making sure they are picked up by their parents/guardians.
- All children **MUST** fill in the details on the back of their race number and wear this on their front.
- All school leaders will receive a Risk Assessment for the event via email prior to the event.
- A dedicated member of the PSSP team supported by the route manager will sweep the course and will be carrying a radio.
